The Rochester Temporary Custodial facility is a 300 person prison for young offenders which is due for completion June 2008.

As part of the scheme all the existing farm buildings and the swimming pool was demolished. The materials were crushed and then re-used for the construction of the car park and road bases on the site.

All the materials from the demolition were re-used on site.

**We saved our Customer £270,000!**

### Key benefits:

#### Environmental

We eliminated pollution from 200 thirty five tonne lorry movements which would have been required to transport the material offsite

We eliminated pollution from having to import 4000m<sup>3</sup> of material which would have been required for non structural base to the car park and road bases on the site

- We eliminated adding to existing landfill
- We eliminated potential damage to existing roads
- We eliminated disruption to the local community

#### Financial

We saved the Client approximately £70,000 not having to export material to landfill
